

Disabled Veteran Program

The Idaho Department of Parks and Recreation (IDPR) offers 100% disabled Idaho Veterans, with 100% service-related disabilities free camping and day-use access within Idaho's State Parks.

Upon proof of eligibility, a lifetime, wallet-sized pass is issued allowing Idaho Veterans the opportunity to take advantage of the program.

The Program

The program entitles eligible Idaho Veterans to free Idaho State Park day-use access and one free campsite per overnight stay.

Day-Use access is limited to one personal vehicle per day.

Campers are responsible for campsite reservation fees.

Camping is limited to a maximum of 15-days per 30-day period within the Idaho State Park system.

Eligibility

Idaho Veterans determined to be 100% disabled, having 100% service-related disabilities, with written proof from the Idaho Department of Veteran's Affairs are eligible for IDPR program.

A wallet-sized pass will be issued by IDPR once eligibility has been verified.

Obtaining a Pass*

1. Obtain a letter from the Department of Veterans Affairs located at 444 Fort Street, Boise Idaho 83702, (208-557-2300) verifying your eligibility.
2. Complete a veteran discount application.
3. Mail or fax your completed application and a copy of your letter from Veteran's Affairs to: Idaho Dept. of Parks and Recreation ATTN: Veteran's Park Pass P.O. Box 83720, Boise ID 83720-0065. Fax: (208) 334-3741. Your pass will be mailed to the address you provide.

** Passes are non-transferable*

Using Your Pass

When visiting Idaho State Parks, please check in at the information station or visitor center, present your Veteran's Pass and obtain a fee envelope. You may also obtain envelopes at self-pay stations.

Mark on the outside of the envelope "Veteran Pass Holder" and place the envelope on the dashboard of your vehicle. You may also place your Veteran's Pass card next to the envelope.

Applications

You may choose to utilize the application on this brochure. Veteran discount applications are also available at all Idaho State Parks, Regional Service Centers (Boise, Idaho Falls, Coeur d' Alene) and online.

Reservations

Reservations are not required within Idaho's State Parks, but they are recommended. Reservation fees apply. See our website for details.
